
Where relatively fast motions are involved, cams should be designed such that the limit switch will be held operated long enough to operate relays, valves,




Limit switches are designed for proper performance with the actuators with which they are supplied. Supplementary actuators should not be used unless the limit switches are specifically designed for them.




Operating mechanisms for limit switches should be so designed that, under any operating or emergency conditions, the limit switch is not operated beyond its overtravel limit position. A limit switch should not be used as a mechanical stop.




11. For limit switches with pushrod actuators, the actuating force should be applied as nearly as possible in line with the pushrod axis.




For limit switches with lever actuators, the actuating force should be applied as nearly perpendicular to the lever as practical and perpendicular to the shaft axis about which the lever rotates.

Limit switches should be mounted rigidly and in readily accessible locations, with suitable clear-ances to permit easy service and replacement when necessary. Cover plates should face the maintenance
